DRIVING PRIVILEGES ARE NOT ALLOWED:

If three or more non-compliance suspensions
If no insurance
On a 12pt suspension

RESTRICTED PLATES

2nd offense: DUS 4510.11; DUS-FRA or 4510.14
DOF 4510.16; DUS-OVI 4510.14
